Dear Landowner:

Enable Gas Transmission, LLC (EGT)¹ is an interstate natural gas pipeline company that provides open access transportation services for various shippers. EGT is a wholly owned subsidiary of Enable Midstream Partners, LP (Enable Midstream), which is a limited partnership jointly owned by CenterPoint Energy, Inc., OGE Energy Corp. and ArcLight Capital Partners, LLC. Enable Midstream is a midstream company with complementary transmission, gathering, processing, compression and storage assets. With more than 8,400 miles of interstate natural gas pipeline, 2,300 miles of intrastate pipeline, and 11,000 miles of gathering pipeline, Enable Midstream is committed to operating and constructing our facilities in harmony with the environment.

EGT, on behalf of various shippers, transports and delivers natural gas to distributors for resale and ultimate public consumption; to industrial customers for their own use and consumption; and to third party pipeline interconnects located in Arkansas, Illinois, Kansas, Louisiana, Mississippi, Missouri, Oklahoma, Tennessee and Texas. EGT is a limited liability company organized and existing under the laws of the state of Delaware with its principal office located at 1111 Louisiana, Houston, TX 77002. EGT is a gas company within the meaning of the Natural Gas Act (NGA) and is subject to regulatory jurisdiction of the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC).

Natural gas is an environmentally clean fuel to use in the generation of electricity, commercial and industrial plants and individual homes. The natural gas transported in EGT's pipelines provides environmental benefits to our communities by providing a clean burning fuel for the products and services that we use daily such as electricity generation, plastics, gas heating and many others. U. S. Department of Transportation statistics confirm that natural gas pipelines are one of the safest modes of energy transportation. EGT designs, constructs, tests, operates and maintains its facilities to meet or exceed the requirements of federal pipeline safety regulations.

As an affected landowner or an abutting landowner, you can be assured that EGT will answer any questions that you may have related to a specific project. On-the-ground surveys may be performed during the design phase of any new pipeline and EGT could be seeking your permission to perform these surveys, if needed and if the pipeline route or facility site is on your property. We may also be seeking to acquire easements from landowners for the pipeline right-of-way, facility site, and/or access roads. These easements may be temporary to provide for

construction workspace, permanent to provide for a facility site or pipeline permanent right-ofway, or a combination of the two. In some cases, EGT may also acquire a fee interest at selected locations from landowners for the construction of aboveground facilities.

If a temporary easement for construction workspace is acquired, we will need to take precautions for a short period of time to keep activities on the property from interfering with construction work. If a permanent easement for a pipeline right-of-way is needed, EGT will need to maintain a clear right-of-way and have access to our pipeline at all times.

THIS IS THE WORK PROPOSED TO BE PERFORMED:

CEGT proposes to replace approximately 800 feet of Line AM-145. The existing 800 foot segment of 12-inch natural gas pipeline will be taken out of service and removed. Approximately 800 feet of new 12-inch natural gas pipeline will be installed in the same trench the existing pipe currently occupies. The new replacement segment will be installed utilizing a 75 foot temporary right-of-way (ROW) during the construction phase of the project, and a 40 foot permanent ROW will be maintained for the operation of the pipeline. Following construction, the 35 foot width of temporary ROW will be allowed to revert to preconstruction conditions and uses. The project will be located within Section 29 / T 5 S / R 9 W, Jefferson County, Arkansas

CEGT currently anticipates that construction of the proposed facilities will begin in October 2013 and be substantively complete by January 2014, subject to obtaining all applicable federal, state and local permits and approvals.

Enclosed with this letter is information for your use. The information includes:

- A project fact sheet that identifies EGT and FERC points of contact for the project and explains CEGT's environmental complaint resolution procedure; and
- An informational brochure prepared by the FERC entitled "An Interstate Natural Gas Facility on My Land? What Do I Need To Know?"

The enclosed information will hopefully answer many of the questions that you may have. However, if you have other questions or comments, EGT encourages you to contact the person(s) designated at the telephone number and website address provided in the enclosed project fact sheet. If EGT does not receive any comments within 45 days of the date of this letter, EGT will consider that there are no concerns from you, the landowner.

As a continuing part of our commitment to safety, we have enclosed our pipeline safety brochure entitled "A Message For You About Pipeline Safety." Please read and share this information with your family, friends and neighbors. We would also like to remind you that 811 is the national "Call Before You Dig!" number, and dialing 811 will connect you with the One Call Center responsible for your area. Please remember to always call this number prior to any type of excavation activity. It is a free service, and it is the law. In case of a pipeline emergency, call EGT at 1-800-474-1954.

We at EGT are proud of the work that we do to ensure harmony between our natural gas pipeline facilities and the environment. Thank you in advance for your support and cooperation in the construction of these facilities and our efforts to provide a safe, reliable, and environmentally friendly fuel for your daily needs.

If for any reason you are still not satisfied with the response received from EGT, you may contact the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission's (FERC or Commission) Dispute Resolution Service Helpline using the contact information provided below.

Federal Energy Regulatory Commission Contacts

Because EGT is regulated by the FERC and the proposed project will be subject to FERC authority, the FERC now requires that interstate pipeline companies describe how FERC personnel may be contacted if affected landowners so desire.

Any person affected by either the construction or operation of a certificated natural gas pipeline under the Natural Gas Act may seek the informal resolution of a dispute by calling or writing the Commission's Dispute Resolution Service. Any person who contacts the Dispute Resolution Service Helpline is not precluded from filing a formal action with the Commission if discussions assisted by the Dispute Resolution Service staff are unsuccessful at resolving the matter. A caller may terminate the use of alternative dispute resolution procedures at any time.
