Downtown Evansville Community
Development Corporation | \$1 million

CenterPoint Energy Square (Community Vitality)

A vacant block in the heart of Downtown Evansville will be transformed into a park and housing project with funding from CenterPoint Energy. The funding will help the park become a vibrant hub of year-round activity, entertainment, eating, and community connection.

Hoosiers Read | \$1 million

Dolly Parton Imagination Library (Education)

CenterPoint Energy Foundation contributed \$1 million to expand Dolly Parton's Imagination Library to four counties throughout Indiana - Madison, Monroe, Vigo, and Vanderburgh. The funding will provide a free book a month to children aged 5 and under in those counties.

Adjacent to the Boys and Girls Club is a baseball field used by students and the community. The grant replaced the grass field with turf, new dugouts, and a scoreboard. Improvements will serve not only the Boys and Girls Club but also Special Olympics and local little league teams.

Southern University System | \$25,000

Funding will support the Five-Fifths Agenda which seeks to increase the number of African-American male bachelor degree graduates and to influence the national dialogue between African-American men and America.


Hurricane Relief | \$25,000

Serve Minnesota | \$100,000


Minnesota Reading Corps (Education)

Jackson State University | \$30,000


CSET Coding Academy (Education)

Through this funding, 430 devices were distributed to Dayton youth as well as programming focused on increasing digital literacy.

Rebuilding Together Dayton | \$50,000

Seasonal Safe @ **Home-Heat the Town** (*Community Vitality*)

Heat the Town is a partnership with local HVAC technicians and plumbers who perform furnace checks and tune-ups to ensure elderly homeowners' furnaces are clean and safe, thus allowing homeowners to remain warm in the winter months. Funding provides for furnace checks and repair or installation of new furnaces and water heaters if needed.

Boonshoft Museum of Discovery | \$30,000

Do Lab Programming (Education)

The Do Lab is a hands-on, educational science lab at the Boonshoft Museum of Discovery in Dayton. Programs utilizing this space include engaging in-person and virtual activities sparking excitement and a love for learning, particularly in STEM. Funding will sponsor enhancements to these programs.

Complete Communities Initiative | \$2.8 million

(Community Vitality)

An initiative of Mayor Turner, Complete Communities seeks to improve the quality of life of under-resourced neighborhoods in the city of Houston. CenterPoint Energy supported three projects in 2021 in Acres Home and Sunnyside specifically as well as home weatherization throughout all of the Complete Communities.

Winter Storm Relief | \$1.765 million

(Disaster Relief)

As the Greater Houston area responded to Winter Storm Uri, CenterPoint Energy stepped up to contribute \$1 million to the Relief Fund and worked with the Houston Food Bank and Kids Meals to replace food lost during the storm. Additional funding went to support organizations in the Galveston area as well.

SERJobs | **\$200,000**

Outreach to Opportunity (Education)

SERJobs is completing a new Workforce Training Center as well as an innovative new strategy for reaching and serving low-income individuals in need, particularly Opportunity Youth (youth aged 16-24 who are disconnected from school/work). Funding provided will help SERJobs launch new career training pathways and GED classes, establish 2 social enterprises, provide hands-on paid work experience opportunities, and double the number of individuals served annually.
