**Expansion of Program** (Education)

Dolly Parton's Imagination Library provides a free book a month to children birth-5 years old. The availability of the program is based on your zip code and Foundation funding will allow Johnson County to expand to cover the last remaining zip code so every child within the county has access. Studies show children who have access to the program have higher Kindergarten readiness scores than those who do not.



#### Rent and Mortgage Relief | \$150,000

#### ServeMN | **\$100,000**


#### Minnesota Math Corps (Education)

#### Bridge Builders Leadership Initiative | \$21,000


#### "Bridge the Gap" STEM Project (Education)

#### Dayton Metro Library | \$50,000


#### **Summer Challenge Programming (Education)**

#### City of Galveston | \$125,000


Hooper Multi-Purpose Fields (Community Vitality)
