1 We start by carefully reviewing 40+ environmental and land use criteria to create potential electric transmission line location options that minimize local impacts.

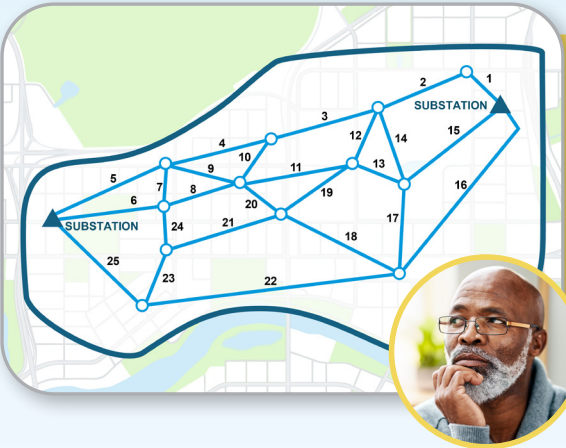

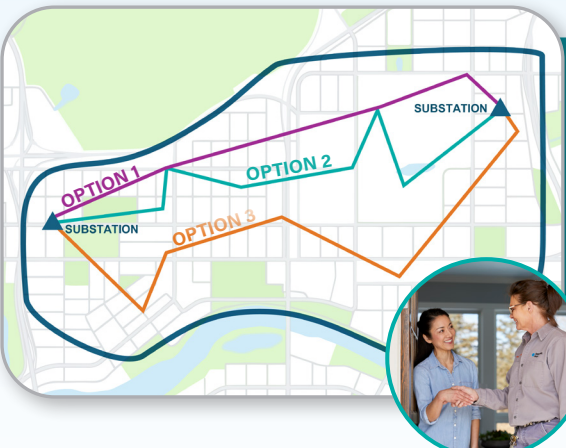
2 We engage local community members at open houses and webinars to help shape the design of the project and get their feedback on potential electric transmission line location options.

Q: How will the proposed transmission project benefit my community?

It is designed to deliver meaningful benefits for your community, including strengthening storm resiliency and reliability, increasing energy capacity to support the growing energy needs of local and regional industries, providing new tax revenue for community services and school districts, creating new Texas jobs, and empowering the local economy throughout the project.

Q: What is the timeline for the transmission project?

We are in the preliminary planning stage of this project and are three or more years away from construction. We are seeking input from local property owners and community members, which will help us evaluate potential electric transmission line location options.
