Caution: Avoid Risk to Yourself and Others – “Call Before You Clear”

In 2010, a home in Saint Paul, Minn., was destroyed after a sewer cleaner’s auger struck an underground natural gas line that intersected a sewer line. As a company that may perform this work, we wanted to make you aware of a potential safety hazard known as “cross-bores.”

“Cross-bores” occur when natural gas lines are unintentionally installed through sewer and/or septic lines. The hazard occurs when mechanical equipment used to unclog sewer and septic lines hits and penetrates a natural gas line which then can lead to a dangerous and unintended release of natural gas.

Together, participating natural gas utility companies in Minnesota and other states are asking plumbers, sewer cleaning contractors and customers to contact the natural gas utility serving the area before they attempt to clear a sewer line.

When you call, the participating utility will determine whether an in-sewer camera inspection is needed. If an in-sewer camera inspection is needed, the participating utility will send a professionally trained sewer camera contractor to the location to complete an inspection. There is no charge for any required in-sewer camera inspections.

We have developed a website to provide you, your employees and the public information on the issue of cross-bores. The website (www.callbeforeyouclear.com) includes a safety video, frequently asked questions regarding cross-bores and information about what you should do before clearing a sewer line. Please spend some time reviewing the website and learning more about this issue.

So before you or a member of your company attempts to clear a sewer or septic line, please contact the natural gas utility serving the area to ensure there are no conflicts with underground natural gas lines.
